Dear Parents,

We are excited that you are sending your child to Camp Victory this summer! We are praying for the Lord to bless our summer and are looking forward to memories made and lives changed. We hope that you will find many answers to your questions in this information packet.

Price of Camp & Discounts

- **Full price is \$300.** A \$75 deposit is required to hold your child's spot. The \$300 includes all activities, meals, and the snack fee.
- **Multiple Child Discount** – If you are sending multiple children (3 or more) from the same immediate family, you will automatically receive a \$50 discount on the 3rd child & up. (First two children will pay full price.)
- **Mailbox Club Scholarship** – Campers who complete their Mailbox Club Bible lessons will receive a \$60 scholarship. This will be applied to the child's account after the lesson completion deadline in April. All lessons must be started (first lesson postmarked back to us) by January 31 and completed by April 15th. Do NOT wait until campers have finished lessons to register because spots fill quickly!
- **Please note that campers will not be allowed to register for more than 1 week of summer camp.** Our registrations and waiting lists have increased greatly over the last couple of years, and we desire that as many kids as possible get to experience a week of summer camp.

Cancellations & Refunds (NEW for 2025)

If it is necessary for you to cancel your child's registration, please contact us as soon as possible; we usually have long waiting lists. **New for 2025 -- The \$75 deposit is non-refundable for any cancellation after May 1st!**

Roommate Preference

You may specify one or two names during online registration. We will honor this if possible. For those coming with a church group, please specify someone in your group or enter the church name. Larger groups requesting each other may have to be split into multiple cabins. Our cabins hold 8-11 campers.

Food Allergies

If your child has special dietary needs please contact our Food Service Director prior to arrival so that we can work out a plan for your child. The allergy section of the registration portal has a listing of common food allergies so please complete it. We regret that we do not have the resources to accommodate all individual needs and preferences. We may ask that you bring items to supplement. Any foods to be heated should be microwave ready. Please clearly label with your child's name. We do not have facilities to cook extra items from scratch. They need to be ready to "heat and serve" from microwave or oven. Your child's health and safety are very important to us—we want to do everything we can to assure that your child has a great time at camp. More information will be emailed to you before your child's camp week.

What to Bring

- ◇ Bible, notebook, pen/pencil
- ◇ Pillow; sleeping bag or sheets for bunk bed
- ◇ Towels & toiletries
- ◇ Modest clothing and swimsuit (See Dress Code)
- ◇ 2 pairs of shoes are recommended; closed-toed shoes are required for the climbing wall
- ◇ Set of clothes that can get dirty for games, etc.
- ◇ Camera (cell phones not allowed)
- ◇ Medication in original containers (See Medications Below)
- ◇ Spending Money (see below)
- ◇ **Optional:** flashlight, sunscreen, raincoat, bug spray, fishing tackle
- ◇ **Please do not bring:** electronics of any kind (cell phones, cellular enabled watches, tablets, gaming devices, etc.); weapons; any kind of tobacco, e-cigarettes, vape pens, alcohol, or other drugs.

General Dress Code:

Please dress modestly and neatly in keeping with high Christian standards. Clothing must cover all undergarments. Please avoid extreme dress, hairstyles, and jewelry. Please do not wear clothing that portrays suggestive or derogatory pictures and messages, including advertising of alcohol, tobacco, etc. Modest swimsuits; one-piece or tankinis (no bikinis, no bare midriffs); casual clothes for daily activities; we prefer fingertip length shorts (or longer). We reserve the right to restrict any clothing deemed inappropriate.

Detailed Dress Code (Weeks of June 23-27 & June 30-July 4)

Clothing must cover all undergarments. Shoulder straps should be at least 2 inches in width. Clothing should not be skintight or revealing. There are to be no bare midriffs; no sagging waistlines, please. Only fingertip length shorts (or longer) are permitted. Dress/skirts (including slits) should be no shorter than the top of the knee. Both the "general" and "detailed" dress codes will be enforced during these weeks. We reserve the right to restrict any clothing deemed inappropriate.

Medications

We will not dispense any camper's prescription or over-the-counter medications if they are not in the original container. Prescription medications must have the child's name, drug, dosage, and date clearly indicated. Please note that we can only dispense over-the-counter medications as directed on the bottle, so any OTC medications must be applicable to your child (for example, melatonin that is labeled for adult use cannot be dispensed to children by our first aid personnel). All medications must be checked in at registration and kept in first aid. If your child takes a controlled medication, please only send the amount needed for the week in the original prescription container. We keep basic first aid supplies on hand.

Spending Money

We have a Snack Shop and Camp Store (gift shop) for campers. Campers' snack fees are included in the registration fee so they will not need additional money for snack shop. Campers will be allowed to visit the snack shop 2-3 times a day and choose 1 or 2 items each visit. Our Camp Store has a variety of water bottles, souvenirs, and T-shirts (\$15-\$30). You can add money to your child's store account during online registration or log back in at a later date.

Missionary Offerings

Each week we have missionary speakers at camp who present a special project related to their work. Campers are given an opportunity during chapel each evening to give an offering to the project.

Homesickness

In case of extreme homesickness, we will contact parents to notify them of the situation and ask them to recommend a course of action.

Lost & Found

Please be sure names are on clothing and other belongings such as cameras, Bibles, etc. Please contact the camp office and clearly identify lost items that you want returned to you; we ask that you pay postage. Items not called for within 30 days will be given away.
